• Project Background

Girls'Day is a highly successful initiative from Germany aimed at encouraging young girls to explore **careers in industries where women are underrepresented, particularly in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics), skilled trades, and leadership roles.** Established over two decades ago, the program has proven to be a powerful tool in shaping the future workforce by inspiring young talent at an early stage.

In 2026, **AHK Sri Lanka is organizing the second edition of Girls'Day in Sri Lanka** to address the disproportionately low representation of women in STEM and leadership careers. Our goal is to create an environment that **fosters encouragement and opportunity**, equipping young girls with the confidence and exposure they need to pursue these career paths.

Key Responsibilities

- ✓ Grant permission for a **day off** to enable schoolgirl participation.

- 👉 We will manage the **administration and promotion** of the program, including:
 - Creating an **event information page** on the AHK Sri Lanka website.
 - Developing **marketing materials** to support participating companies and schools.
 - **Coordinate the registration** between the companies and the schools.
 - Be the **contact person** for any arising questions.

Why Should Your School Participate?

- ✓ **Develop a Future Talent Pipeline** – Girls'Day introduces young female students to career paths in industry, especially where females are worldwide underrepresented, helping to attract and nurture diverse talent for the long term.
- ✓ **Counteract against the disparity of female STEM education and professional realm among girls** – Women accounted for nearly half (49%) of undergraduate enrollments in STEM subjects at local universities. Meanwhile, in the professional setting underrepresentation is still influenced by persistent gender stereotypes and societal norms. By enabling your girls to participate in Girls'Day, you can contribute in breaking these stereotypes.
- ✓ **Promote Workforce Diversity** – Encouraging more young women to explore non-traditional career paths helps reduce gender disparities in technical and leadership roles, benefiting industry and society at large.

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
